Hazrat Abu Hurairah^{ra} reported that the Holy Prophet^{sa} said, "Allah, the Blessed and Exalted, has mobile (squads) of angels, who have no other work (to attend to but) to follow the assemblies of zikr (remembrance) and when they find such assemblies in which there is remembrance (of Allah), they sit in them and some of them surround the others with their wings till the space between them and the sky of the world is fully covered, and when they disperse (after the assembly of remembrance is adjourned), they go upward to heaven and Allah, the Exalted and Glorious, asks them, although He is best informed about them: 'Where have you come from?' They say: 'We come from Your servants upon the earth who had been glorifying You, extolling Your greatness, professing Your oneness, praising You, and begging of You.' He would say: 'What do they beg of Me?' They would say: 'They beg of You Your Paradise.' He would say: 'Have they seen My Paradise?' They would say: 'No, our Lord.' He would say: '(How would they be) if they were to see My Paradise?' They would say: 'They seek Your protection.' He would say: 'Against what do they seek My protection?' They would say: 'Our Lord, from the Hell-Fire.' He would say: 'Have they seen My Fire?' They would say: 'No.' He (the Lord) would say: '(How would they be) if they were to see My Fire?' They would say: 'They beg forgiveness of You.' He would say: 'I grant pardon to them, and confer upon them what they ask for and grant them protection against which they seek protection.' They (the angels) would again say: 'Our Lord, there is one amongst them—such and such sinful servant who happened to pass by (that assembly) and sat there along with them.' He would say: 'I also grant him pardon, for they are a people whose fellows are in no way unfortunate."

April 5, 2024

THE PHILOSOPHY OF PRAYERS & SUPPLICATIONS FOR PROTECTION

Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V (may Allah be his Helper!) continued discussing the importance and philosophy of prayer, as illuminated by the sayings of the Promised Messiah (peace be upon him), and how prayers should be offered.

Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) said that when we pray, we should maintain a humble demeanour, entrusting all our concerns solely to Allah, the One Who can deliver us from our trials. From the perspective of the Jama'at, it is crucial to remember that only Allah can rescue us from the challenges faced in Pakistan and some other countries. Even on a personal level, it is Allah alone Who fulfils all our needs and provides for us. We should infuse our prayers with anguish and focus more intently on them.

Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) then proceeded to cite some prayers from the Holy Qur'an, the Sunnah, and sayings of the Promised Messiah (peace be upon him) and instructed that they should be offered regularly. The Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said that the example of those who remember Allah and those who do not is like that of the living and the dead. We should strive to be counted among the living—those who keep themselves busy with the remembrance of Allah.

At the end, Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) said: May Allah grant us the ability to pray from our hearts. Let us pray in our own language, and let those prayers come from the depths of our hearts, from a place of genuine longing and desperation. Also, pray to keep the blessings of Ramadan everlasting. Let us seek the blessings of this Friday and all the Fridays to come.

April 12, 2024 REMEMBERING THE MARTYRS OF UHUD

In this Friday Sermon, Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) mentioned some faith-inspiring incidents of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) and his Companions^{ra}, which took place after the Battle of Uhud.

It is reported that the mother of Hazrat Amr bin Mu'adh (may Allah be pleased with him), who was martyred at Uhud, approached the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) as he was returning from the battle. Upon seeing her, he expressed his condolences at the martyrdom of her son. But she responded, "Seeing you safe and sound [O Messenger of Allah], all my grief and calamity have vanished." The Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said, "Rejoice and share this joyful news with the families of all other martyrs that they are united in Paradise and have interceded and prayed to Allah for their loved ones."

Speaking of the sacrifices made by female Companions, Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih II (may Allah be pleased with him) addressed Ahmadi women and said, "These are the women who stood shoulder to shoulder with men in spreading and preaching Islam, and these are the women that the Islamic world admires. You also profess faith in the Promised Messiah (peace be upon him) and acknowledge him as a reflection of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him). In that sense, you are reflection of Sahabiyat of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him), but let me ask you: Do you possess the same fervour for serving religion that characterized the Sahabiyat?"

In the latter part of the sermon, Huzoor (may Allah be his Helper!) spoke about the following recently deceased members of the Jama'at and announced to lead their funeral prayer in absentia after the Friday prayer: (1) Mustafa Ahmad Khan Sahib, youngest maternal grandson of the Promised Messiah (peace be upon him); and (2) Dr. Mir Dawud Ahmad Sahib of the USA, former Secretary Jai'dad USA Jama'at.



April 19, 2024 MARTYRS OF UHUD & EXPEDITION OF HAMRA'UL ASAD

Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V (may Allah be his Helper!) related further accounts that shed light on the noble life and character of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) in the context of the Battle of Uhud.

Hazrat Musleh Mau'ud (may Allah be pleased with him) said that when the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) returned from the Battle of Uhud, he was quite weak due to his injuries, and the Sahaba helped him dismount from his horse. After offering Maghrib prayer, the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) went home. The women of Madinah had already received news of the martyrdom of their men and had begun to wail. The Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) was deeply moved by these cries, and his Hamza, have also been martyred, yet there is no one to cry for him.' When the women heard of this, they gathered at the Holy Prophet's house and started wailing for Hazrat Hamza. After some time had passed, the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon ĥim) said, 'May Allaĥ have mercy on the women of Madinah, for they have shown sympathy towards me. I know that the Ansar too have great love for me.' However, he said, 'To lament in such a manner is displeasing to Allah.' When it was said that this was the people's custom and that they needed to vent their emotions in this way, the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said, 'I do not forbid crying, but tell these women not to slap their faces, tear their clothes, or pull out their hair.'

Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) said that the events related to the Battle of Uhud had reached their conclusion and that he would now mention the expedition of Hamra'ul Asad, which took place in the month of Shawwal 3 AH. This expedition is essentially a continuation and culmination of the Battle of Uhud. Due to the results obtained from this expedition, the Battle of Uhud is considered a victory for the Muslims.

In the latter part of the sermon, Huzoor (may Allah be his Helper!) spoke about the following recently deceased members of the Jama'at and announced to lead their funeral prayer in absentia after the Friday prayer: (1) Maulana Ghulam Ahmad Nasim Sahib, a dedicated missionary of the Jama'at; and (2) Dr. Ahsanullah Zafar Sahib, former National Amir of Jama'at Ahmadiyya USA.

April 26, 2024 THE EXPEDITION OF HAMRA'UL ASAD

Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) said that upon learning of the Quraish's plan to retaliate and attack Madinah, the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) summoned Hazrat Abu Bakr and Hazrat Umar (may Allah be pleased with them) for consultation, and both of them said, "O Messenger of Allah! Let us confront the enemy outside the city to prevent harm to our children." After the Fajr prayer, the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) summoned the people and had Hazrat Bilal (may Allah be pleased with him) announce that everyone should prepare to meet the enemy, and that only those who had participated in the Battle of Uhud should go out for the battle.

Biographers write that the Holy Prophet's decision to pursue the enemy was extremely wise. The hypocrites believed that going after the enemy with depleted numbers was extremely dangerous, but subsequent events proved the sagacity of the Holy Prophet's decision which resulted in great benefits for the Muslims. This decision elevated the morale of the Muslims, while the hearts of the hypocrites were overawed by the strength and determination of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him). On the other hand, when the enemy received the news that the Islamic army was coming after them, they lost their nerve.

At the end of the sermon, Huzoor (may Allah be his Helper!) spoke about Faraz Ahmad Tahir Sahib, who was martyred in Australia in a knife attack at a shopping centre where he worked as a security guard. Huzoor (may Allah be his Helper!) said that his sacrifice exemplifies his commitment to religious freedom, demonstrating that he did not flee his homeland out of fear of death. May Allah elevate the status of the deceased and grant courage to his grieving relatives. Ameen!


The Enlightening Words of Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V (may Allah be his Helper!)

HOMEOPATHIC MEDICINE

A group of 23 Khuddam from Conneticuit, USA, travelled to the UK for a meeting with Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V (may Allah be his Helper!) on January 14, 2024. During the meeting, a Khadim sought advice on the use of homeopathic medicine while undergoing allopathic treatment. Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) replied:

"We should not rely on and trust only one [type of] medicine. If you think that homeopathy can be useful for the treatment for an ailment, even as a supplement, then you can use it ... Once, Hazrat Musleh-e-Mau'ud (may Allah be pleased with him) was taking some medicine. He took allopathic medicine first, then native Ayurvedic medicine, then after that he took homeopathic medicine. Somebody standing by asked him how he would know which medicine would work after having taken the different medicines. He replied, 'I don't trust any of those medicines. I trust in Allah the Almighty. I don't know which of the medicine has been blessed by Allah the Almighty to work on my ailment. So, this is why I'm using all of them.'"

ON PALESTINE AND INTERNATIONAL PEACE

On January 7, 2024, Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V (may Allah be his Helper!) held a virtual meeting with Majlis Ansarullah from France. The Amila members joined the meeting virtually from Masjid Moubarak in Paris, France.

A Nasir asked Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) what measures need to be taken by international organizations to uphold peace after witnessing continued failures in establishing peace across the world.

Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) responded:

"In the First World War, the League of Nations was founded in order to preserve peace in the world, to keep the world united as one and to prevent wars and destruction. They said they would not allow for another war to happen, but what was the outcome? These very institutions in the world failed to uphold justice, which consequently led to the commencement of the Second World War in 1939. Subsequently, they founded the United Nations and granted veto power to a few countries. How could justice be upheld after that?"

He further elaborated:

"This situation will last for as long as there is no equality or fairness (in international relations). Chaos continues to stem from veto power. What is the case now? Israel is committing injustices ... Hamas killed 1,300 of their people, but Israel has killed ten times as many innocents in retaliation ... Nobody has the courage to condemn the Israeli Government... (Historically,) it was the Germans and the Europeans who committed injustices against the Jews-it was not the Palestinians. They are having to pay the price for the fault of others ... In Africa, [the oppressed] are not Muslims, they are Christians or pagans, yet these nations have also looted and usurped them. All their resources and minerals have been looted. African nations have also begun to raise their voices against this. They have started exclaiming that they have been exploited by the Europeans. Sometimes the name of religion is used but in reality, the true reason is geopolitical gain. They do not uphold justice, but still proudly proclaim themselves to be the 'champions of justice' and 'champions of peace."

Huzoor (may Allah be his Helper!) concluded:

"True peace will only be established when Allah the Almighty spreads Islam through the Community of the Promised Messiah (peace be upon him). Thus, we must continue making a personal effort – through prayer and by working hard ... For as long as this solution does not come into fruition, the oppressed will continue to suffer in the same way."

INSTILLING LOVE FOR KHILAFAT IN CHILDREN

Another Nasir asked Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V (may Allah be his Helper!) how love for Khilafat can be instilled in the hearts of the youth, particularly their own children.

Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) answered:

"Offer financial sacrifices in remembrance of Allah's favours and offer two voluntary prayers daily. Allah the Almighty says that if one is grateful to Him, He will, surely, bestow more favours upon him. Thus, if you are grateful to Allah the Almighty, He will raise you in your relationship with Allah and will increase you in your wealth and blessings. To establish a relationship with Allah, it is essential you strive for it. The Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings be upon him) said that when a person takes one step towards Allah the Almighty, Allah takes two steps towards the person. When a person draws close to Allah



the Almighty by one space of the hand, Allah draws closer to him by two, and when a person walks with pace towards Allah the Almighty, Allah comes running towards him. So, man ought to first make an effort himself, and when you do make an effort, Allah the Almighty will then further develop the relationship."

Huzoor-e-Anwar (may Allah be his Helper!) continued:

"Of foremost importance is establishing a relationship with God Almighty. Build a personal relationship with Allah and pray for your children. The prayers of parents for their children are accepted, and so too are the prayers of children for their parents. Pray that God Almighty grants your children His nearness and brings them closer to their faith and to the Community of the Promised Messiah and Mahdi (peace be upon him) which was prophesied by the Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings be upon him) according to the Promise of Allah the Almighty, as well as with Khilafat.

"When you reach this threshold and when you supplicate to Allah and lead by example and advise your children with love, they will then begin to develop the connection [with Khilafat]. Do not expect your children to establish this relationship once they are older, rather you should instil this in their hearts from childhood."

Significance of Obligatory Financial Donations

Il male and female earning members of the Jama'at are reminded to pay their obligatory donations (Chanda Aam or Wasiyyat and Chanda Jalsa Salana) according to the prescribed rates. These donations were stipulated by the Promised Messiah (peace be upon him).

Syedna Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V (may Allah be his Helper!) said: "Remember, Allah knows full well what you spend, what you pledge, and whatever is your income. Always try to clear your accounts with Him. To get a reward from Allah the Almighty, you must provide your budget according to your true income and make regular payments according to the prescribed rates, so that your spiritual condition improves and so you may excel in righteousness." (Friday Sermon, May 28, 2004)

Young male and female earning members (Khuddam and Lajna) are also urged to participate in these obligatory donations and pay according to the prescribed rates.

It is not expected from Jama'at members who are the part of system of Wasiyyat—the *musian*—that they are not offering Chanda Wasiyyat as per the prescribed rates. They have promised with Allah that they will at least pay 10% of their take-home income as Chanda Wasiyyat. So, all *musian* are very humbly requested to ensure that their Chanda Wasiyyat and Chanda Jalsa Salana is according to the prescribed rates.

In a meeting with the National Majlis Amila of Jama'at Germany in 2009, Syedna Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V (may Allah be his Helper!) highlighted the importance of obligatory donations over all other donations, saying: "If someone is not paying Chanda Aam, no other Chanda (auxiliary, *tabrikat*, etc.) should be accepted from them."

In other words, Chanda Aam or Wasiyyat and Chanda Jalsa Salana have precedence over all other donations. It is necessary for all earning members to pay obligatory donations regularly as per the prescribed rates.

Therefore, all earning male and female members are requested to please contact your Secretary Finance and check your payments of obligatory donations, and in case of arrears, to pay them as early as possible.

Carry out duties with hard work and excellent morals

"Each and every person on duty and those in charge must carry out their duties with hard work, excellent morals, prayers while seeking the help of Allah Almighty. When this happens, then Allah the Almighty will shower His blessings. We have presented ourselves to selflessly serve the guests of the Promised Messiah (peace be upon him), who have travelled here purely for a religious purpose."

Uphold your passion to serve

"The passion with which you have presented yourselves to serve, you must continue to uphold this same passion for however long you are serving in your respective duties."

Fulfil the rights of worshipping Allah

"Where you are fulfilling the rights of serving the guests, never forget this fact that we must also fulfil the rights of worshipping Allah the Almighty; we must safeguard our prayers and we must strive to make ourselves pure by deriving benefit from this atmosphere at every moment."

"Having done true justice to your duties, you should never think that you have fulfilled your objective. Without worship, our objective cannot be achieved. Thus, those children, youth, men and women that are on duty, should also remember to fulfil this right [due to Allah the Almighty] as well."

ADVICE FOR GUESTS

Purpose of Jalsa is to improve our spiritual, intellectual and moral condition

"The purpose for which we are attending the Jalsa is to improve our spiritual, intellectual, and moral condition and also to establish the love of Allah the Almighty and His Messenger (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) in our hearts. If one adopts this mindset, one will not remain focused on worldly things. And when one's focus is not on worldly things, then even if there are certain shortcomings in certain arrangements of the Jalsa, the guests will not even feel them; they will think that even if there is any shortcoming on the part of their hosts or the organizers of the Jalsa, it makes no difference to them. Their purpose is solely to improve their spiritual and intellectual condition, which can be achieved by benefitting from the proceedings and speeches of the Jalsa."

Do not wander about during the Jalsa

"Every attendee of the Jalsa should ensure that they do not wander about during the Jalsa and instead listen to the entire proceedings of the Jalsa. Then, during the breaks between the Jalsa sessions for food, prayers and meeting with friends, that time should also be used in the most efficient manner." Everyone should adopt the mindset of giving preference to their brothers over themselves.

A beautiful atmosphere will be established, which will reflect a true atmosphere of believers.

Do not search for weaknesses in the organization of Jalsa

"Separate yourself entirely from worldly endeavours and strive to improve in your faith and knowledge. When this happens, it will also improve mutual love and relations. Even if there are shortcomings in the administration or the hosts, then they will not be felt. A beautiful atmosphere will be established, which will reflect a true atmosphere of believers. If we do not achieve this, then we cannot create the atmosphere that is the objective of the Jalsa. If people begin searching for weaknesses and start complaining, then in such a large-scale and temporary operation, dozens of complaints can arise, as there cannot be perfection. There may be many shortcomings that can cause restlessness."

Appreciate the sincerity of volunteers

"The guests should remember that the people cooking the

food or making the flatbread are not professionals in these fields; rather, they are volunteers who come from different professions, and so the sincerity and passion with which they serve should always be appreciated."

Be kind and greet each other with a smile

"To display a high standard of morals, being kind, meeting each other with a smile and making sacrifices for others is not the sole responsibility of volunteers; rather, the guests should also be especially mindful of this. Without morals, there is nothing. A peaceful atmosphere cannot be established through the good morals of the workers alone; rather, all attendees of the Jalsa must exhibit good morals. Both the ladies and the men should remain mindful of this. Previously, I referenced a Hadith that smiling is a part of faith or that smiling is a form of charity. This should always be remembered."

Give preference to your brothers over yourselves

"Everyone should adopt the mindset of giving preference to their brothers over themselves. If every one of us adopts this mentality with the thought that the rights of others must be fulfilled in order to attain the pleasure of Allah the Almighty, then society will become one of love and affection. The expression of this love and affection will not only remain limited to the three days of Jalsa; rather, one's entire life becomes an example of love and affection."

Overlook each other's faults

"If we strive to overlook each other's faults and establish an environment of peace and compassion, then these three days will achieve the purpose for which we have gathered here."

Cooperate with traffic control volunteers


"Difficulties arise, especially when it comes to traffic, as there is limited space for parking. Parking is made available according to the number of cars, but perhaps this year perhaps there will be more cars, so the space for parking will be limited. If some people are sent to different sites [for parking], then they should show cooperation. Generally, by the grace of Allah the Almighty, people are cooperative because this is how the members of the Jamaat have been trained. However, there are some people who are short-tempered, or who think that they will miss part of the programme of the Jalsa if they are sent to a different site because they will be delayed in getting to the Jalsa site. Such people should remain mindful of the limitations of the organisers. If they are so concerned about attending the Jalsa, then they should arrive ahead of time. Also, those on duty should try to explain things to them in a loving manner instead of arguing with them."

GUIDELINES FOR ALL ATTENDEES

Make a habit of saying "salaam"

"The Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) instructed to make the greeting of "salaam" common in society. Conveying "salaam" is not a mere verbal utterance; rather, when a person says "salaam" from their heart, they also actively think about conveying and spreading peace. Such people also have positive sentiments for one another and they strive and pray to remove others' dif-



Listen to the proceedings of the Jalsa quietly and attentively

"You should try to listen to the proceedings of the Jalsa quietly and attentively. It should not be the case that you listen to some speakers and not others. I have mentioned before as well that you should come and sit [attentively] at the Jalsa. The Promised Messiah (peace be upon him) has expressed great displeasure over the fact that people lisWhere you are fulfilling the rights of serving the guests, never forget this fact that we must also fulfil the rights of worshipping Allah the Almighty You should also pay special attention to the remembrance of Allah and invoking salutations upon the Holy Prophet^{sa}

ten to some speakers because of preferring their passionate oratory, but then they do not listen to others (*Malfuzat*, vol. 1, pp. 398-401). The speakers prepare their speeches with great effort. All the attendees of Jalsa should participate in the entire programme of the Jalsa and strive to attain spiritual and intellectual benefits."

Pay attention to the remembrance of Allah and invoking salutations on the Holy Prophet^{sa}

"You should also pay special attention to the remembrance of Allah and invoking salutations upon the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) [durood] during the days of Jalsa ... It should be recited with the thought that Allah the Almighty may continue elevating the status and rank of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him); that He may continue granting his message success and victory; that He may make his Divine Law lasting and grant it supremacy; that we may benefit from the prayers he made for his *ummah* [nation] and that Allah the Almighty may save this ummah from all forms of deterioration. Today, what is there that Muslims are not doing in the name of Allah the Almighty and His Messenger (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him). They have defamed Islam. May Allah the Almighty grant them understanding and may they accept the Imam of the Age."

Ladies should ensure that children sit quietly

"Whilst in the Jalsa marquee, the ladies especially should ensure that they instil in those children who possess some understanding that they should sit quietly during the Jalsa sessions. It is the training that is done at a young age which remains firm in the mind. Those women who sit in the children's marquee should also try not to speak too much and instead should focus on the proceedings. Sometimes the complaint is received that the children do not make as much noise whereas the women use them as an excuse to converse more amongst themselves. Due attention should be given to this."

Remain aware of your surroundings

"As it pertains to security, every attendee, both on the men's and ladies' sides should remain aware of their surroundings. This is an important method of security."

Members of the Jama'at wait an entire year and look forward to attending the Jalsa. (*Majmu'ah Ishtiharat* [2019], p. 360)

As such, members of the Jama'at should remember these objectives of Jalsa, and try their utmost to absorb the blessings and mercy of Allah in these days. The speeches that are delivered by the speakers at Jalsa are a crucial means of acquiring its blessings. To listen attentively and act upon their presented teachings is the responsibility of every Ahmadi man, woman and child.

Members are also requested to listen to all of the speeches attentively and sincerely, and act upon the true teachings of Islam Ahmadiyyat that will be imparted in them.

Bring About a Pious Change

The Promised Messiah^{as} has said, "And to the best of our ability we shall endeavour to supplicate at the threshold of the Most Merciful that He may draw them towards Him, may accept them and may bring about a pious change in them." (*The Heavenly Decree* [2006], p. 74).

To undergo this pious change and transformation of our inner condition, we need to make special arrangements to offer Salat regularly during the days of Jalsa Salana, and to keep reciting invoking blessings on the Holy Prophet^{sa}, as well as other prayers, to enhance our level of righteousness and create this positive transformation within ourselves.

We should carefully examine the guidelines given by the Khulafa-e-Ahmadiyyat at the occasion of Jalsa, and particularly those given by Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih V^{aa}. Try to act upon and implement these guidelines as best as possible. The Promised Messiah^{as} has said, "Do not consider this convention to be like ordinary human assemblies." (*Majmu'ah Ishtiharat* [2019], vol. 1, p. 361,)

The Jalsa is thus an excellent opportunity to undergo a pious and righteous change. As such, it does not behove an Ahmadi to waste time or engage in ordinary, worldly conversations instead of listening to the programs and speeches of Jalsa. I hope that we will all attend the Jalsa Salana in large numbers while keeping in mind these objectives of Jalsa and reap its full benefits, *Insha'Allah!*

Important Guidelines for Jalsa Salana

We also have the intructions of Huzoor-e-Anwar^{aa} before us regarding steps to be taken for security, "Always keep close watch of your surroundings, to your right, left and on your friends and those whom you know. This will itself be an effective means of security for the Jama'at." Members of the Jama'at should especially keep this in mind.

Similarly, bring your Jama'at ID cards along with you and cooperate fully with the volunteers, even if you have to endure some difficulty. All these arrangements are made for your own safety and security, and can only be effective with your cooperation.

Likewise, give your full cooperation to the volunteers of all departments. It is a great distinction of the Ahmadiyya Jama'at that even if a child is on duty, everyone cooperates with him/her. This is the beauty of our system and also the secret to our success. Sometimes, it is natural that in such large-scale arrangements, there may be certain shortcomings, weaknesses and mistakes. If this is the case, do not get angry or argue with the volunteers of Jalsa.

This is not only the Jalsa of volunteers and workers, rather it is the Jalsa of every member of the Jama'at. It is our collective responsibility to make the Jalsa a success. If you *can* fix a shortcoming in an appropriate manner, then you should do so; otherwise, draw the attention of the relevant volunteers in an appropriate and respectful manner.

If you have a good suggestion for the future, then please send it to me after the Jalsa.

We also have a large number of non-Ahmadi guests at the Jalsa and they should take back a good impression of us in every respect—be it of our morals, our dress, our character, our attendance at Jalsa, our manner of walking, or our manner of sitting. In all aspects, we must demonstrate dignity and respect.

Women should fully observe *purdah*, keeping in view the Islamic teachings and sayings of the Khulafa.

During the days of Jalsa Salana, offer Salat in congregation at the Jalsa Gah, Baitul Islam Mosque and local Salat centres.


General Responsibilities

- Take extra care when it comes to cleanliness. If you see any garbage on the way, make sure to dispose of it.


May Allah enable all of us to fulfill our responsibilities in the best possible manner and render such services as are acceptable to Allah!

THE GREAT MUGHAL EMPEROR Aurangzeb

bul Muzaffar Mohyuddin Aurangzeb, commonly known as Aurangzeb, was the seventh child of Shah Jahan and Mumtaz Mahal. Born in Dohad, Gujarat, on October 24, 1618 C.E., he ruled India from 1658 until his death in 1707. The birth order of Shah Jahan's sons is as follows: (1) Dara Shikoh, (2) Shuja, (3) Aurangzeb, and (4) Murad.

Aurangzeb had a thorough knowledge of the Holy Qur'an and was proficient in Arabic, Persian, and Hindi. He led a simple life, disliked flattery, and, unlike other kings, did not take money from the public treasury. His income came from the books he wrote and his tailoring.

He had four wives: Dilras Bano, Rahmatun-Nisa, Aurangabadi, and Udaipuri, a Hindu lady.

Aurangzeb was known for his calm temperament and immense courage. At the age of 15, he faced an out-of-control elephant alone; at 87, he fought bravely as a soldier in the army surrounding Baganghera.

POWER STRUGGLE

Shah Jahan wanted Dara Shikoh to succeed him as king, but Aurangzeb's extraordinary abilities posed a significant obstacle. To eliminate this obstacle, Shah Jahan frequently sent Aurangzeb on dangerous missions, hoping he would be killed. Contrary to Shah Jahan's wishes, Aurangzeb survived these missions, and his abilities only increased.

Shah Jahan fell ill in Delhi on September 6, 1657, and was moved to Agra on October 26. Dara Shikoh began to rule in his father's name, making many unjust decisions with Shah Jahan's blind support. This created suspicion among Dara's brothers.

Shah Jahan wrote to Murad, promising him the throne if he killed Aurangzeb. Although Shah Jahan failed in this attempt, the letter reveals his enmity towards Aurangzeb.

Observing Dara Shikoh's high-handedness, Shuja, Aurangzeb, and Murad united against him and Shah Jahan. After a great struggle, Aurangzeb entered Agra Fort, where Shah Jahan was living. Shah Jahan was not moved elsewhere. Led by wrong advisers, Murad rebelled against Aurangzeb. After defeating Murad, Aurangzeb imprisoned him in Gwalior Fort. Three years later, on December 4, 1661, two servants killed Murad.

On June 5, Dara Shikoh moved from Agra to Delhi and resumed fighting against Aurangzeb. Ultimately, Aurangzeb was victorious, and Dara was imprisoned. Aurangzeb consulted his advisers about Dara's fate. Danishmand Khan recommended

sparing him, but Shaista Khan, Bahadur Khan, and Raushan Ara (their sister) recommended the death penalty for the kingdom's stability. Muslim divines supported the latter recommendation, which was accepted.

Had the war between Dara and Aurangzeb continued, it would have led to significant loss of life. The death penalty for Dara, taking only one life, was deemed justified for the kingdom's peace and stability.


During this period, Shuja organized an army against Aurangzeb to claim the throne. Ultimately, in January 1659, he was defeated and sought asylum in Burma. There, he joined rebels against the king who gave him asylum. The king executed his family, and Shuja fled to the jungle, where he was killed by the Maghs.

AURANGZEB AS A KING

After these successes, Aurangzeb became the king of India, ruling the country for 50 years (1658–1707).

dent in the temple. His support for temple construction and financing non-Muslim institutions is a significant accomplishment. It is baseless to say that Muslim kings were anti-Hindu." (*Daily Utam Hindu Jullundhar* as quoted in *Weekly Badr*, Qadian, August 8, 1996, p. 11)

During Aurangzeb's reign, two temples were constructed in Weshalpre, Bengal, in 1681, and a third one in 1690. He donated land for a temple in Gaya, Bihar.

HE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART

The true worth of a person is revealed when they are in power. Therefore, it is important to examine how he ruled as a king.

"Aurangzeb built the Bal Sundri Temple in Kashipur. He not only financed the temple's construction but also sent Muslim masons for the work, which is why Mughal architecture is evisubmitted an application to Emperor Aurangzeb suggesting that two of his assistants, who were fire-worshipping Parsis [Zoroastrians], be dismissed because they were disbelievers, quoting the Qur'an: 'O ye who believe! Take not My enemy and your enemy for friends, offering them love.' (60:2)

The Emperor noted on the file: "No fire-worshipper or Hindu can be deprived of his state position because he is an unbeliever.

In 1659, he stopped inscribing the *kalima* [Islamic creed] on Indian coins because both Hindus and Muslims used the coins, and they should be non-denominational.

He was very interested in learning Indian languages. For this purpose, he asked scholars to compile a dictionary so that a person who knows Persian could easily learn Hindi. Under his patronage, scholars compiled a book discussing Hindi and Sanskrit poetry. A manuscript of this book is available in Khuda Baksh Library, Patna, Bihar.

Instead of building large mosques, he renovated old mosques in need of repair.

JUSTICE

The following incident illustrates his standard of justice. A state functionary You have quoted only half of the verse. The full verse is: 'O ye who believe! Take not My enemy and your enemy for friends, offering them love, while they disbelieve in the truth which has come to you and drive out the Messenger and yourselves from your homes merely because you believe in Allah, your Lord.' (60:2) Thus, a Muslim is enjoined not to take as friend only those unbelievers who transgressed against the Muslims and expelled the Prophet and the Community from Makkah. In fact, if you had read on, quite contrary to what you infer, Allah explicitly commands the Muslims in the same chapter: 'Allah forbids you not, respecting those who have not fought against you on account of your religion, and who have not driven you from homes, that you may be kind to them; and act equitably towards them: surely Allah loves those who are equitable.' (60:9) Your request is forthwith rejected.

(Al-Nahl, Fall 1997, pp. 91 - 92)

Another example of his justice is demonstrated in the incident regarding the rebels' attack on Sitara Fort. Thirteen rebels attacked the fort and were subsequently arrested. Some were Hindus, and others were Muslims. Emperor Aurangzeb asked the court Qazi [judge], Akram, about their punishment. The Qazi replied that the Hindu rebels should be forced to accept Islam, and the Muslim rebels should be imprisoned for three years. Aurangzeb rejected this recommendation and asked other Qazis and Muftis for their punishment according to Islamic Sharia. The second group of Qazis recommended the death penalty for all rebels, regardless of their religion. Aurangzeb accepted this recommendation. While punishing criminals, he never differentiated between them based on their religion.

AURANGZEB AND GURU TEGH BAHADUR

The first mention of the execution of Guru Tegh Bahadur, a Sikh Guru, is found in *History of the Sikhs* by an English officer, Matcliff, in which he wrote that Aurangzeb executed the Guru. However, it is worthy of note that earlier history books did not mention such an incident.

Bhai Muni Singh's book, *Bhagat Ratnawali*, published in 1892, mentions that a Sikh, with the Guru's permission, cut his head. Joseph Cunningham (1812–1851) writes that to show his miracle to Aurangzeb, he told him that he had wrapped a mantra around his neck so no sword could harm him. He then signaled one of his disciples to strike his neck with a sword, and the Guru's neck was severed. This incident is narrated by the Guru's close associates. In the second edition of this book, this incident was eliminated because Matcliff's book was published during this period.

Panth Prakash, a book written by Giani Singh, was first published in 1879 and a second time in 1883. Neither edition mentions that the Guru was executed on Aurangzeb's orders for refusing to accept Islam.

There is no doubt that Aurangzeb became cautious because of Guru Gobind Singh's ill plans, but there is no evidence that he ordered the execution of the Guru's two sons. Guru Gobind Singh was killed by a Pathan because the Guru had killed his two sons. Aurangzeb was willing and trying to control the situation, but it did not materialize due to his death in 1707.

There is a misunderstanding that Aurangzeb forced non-Muslims to accept Islam. Here is a historical incident that reveals Aurangzeb's high standard of thinking. As a result of disobedience, Shah Jahan imprisoned Indraman, King of Bandhera. During his tenure as governor, Aurangzeb recommended Indraman's release. Shah Jahan replied that Indraman could only be released if he accepted Islam. Aurangzeb strongly opposed this condition, writing that such an action reflects narrow-mindedness. A manuscript of this letter is still available in Khuda Bakhsh Library, Patna.

WILL OF AURANGZEB

Aurangzeb was a very hard-working king. He never used eyeglasses. Even at the age of 90, his senses were perfect. His memory was extraordinary; he never forgot a person he met, even if only once. In the very last days of his life, he was a bit hard of hearing and started limping due to the wrong treatment of a wounded knee.

The will he wrote before his death also shows that he valued simplicity and economy. He did not want a large amount of money spent on his funeral.


Humble by nature, he always lived like a Sufi (mystic). For these reasons, he is also called 'Alamgir Zinda Peer,' or 'Alamgir, the living saint.'

AURANGZEB THE REFORMER

Hazrat Khalifatul-Masih II (may Allah be pleased with him) stated:

"The importance of the Mujaddids [reformers] who appeared in India lies in the fact that they appeared in the country where the Promised Messiah was destined to appear. Thus, they served as forerunners of the advent of the Promised Messiah (peace and blessings be upon him) ... Every person who works to revive the Faith through divine revelation is a spiritual Mujaddid. Every person who performs any act for the revival of Islam and the Muslims is a Mujaddid [reformer], even if he is not a spiritual Mujaddid.
